How Do I Enroll?

- Must be 18 years old and living in the United States

Classes we offer:

English Language and Civics Education (IELCE):

IELCE classes offer the student instruction in reading, writing, speaking and listening. Students will also learn about U.S. history, geography, citizenship, federal/state/local government, and the legal system. We can also help you to study for the U.S. citizenship test.

The goal for many students will be getting a job, keeping a job, or going to college. Other students may have a goal of registering to vote, voting for the first time, or getting involved in community activities.

Occupational Training:

Students who complete the IELCE are eligible to enroll in the Center's Social and Human Service Assistant Certificate program. The program offers the student the opportunity to earn a Community Health Worker and Medical Secretary Certificate.

Occupational training provides continuing English Language support.

Earn College Credit: Upon successful completion of the occupational training program, you will receive six industry-recognized credentials and 3-credit free electives in the Health Sciences AAS, the Public Health AAS, the Emergency Services Administration AAS, and the Emergency Services Technology AAS degrees.

Student Supports:

During your enrollment, you will be assigned a Student Success Specialist and a Digital Literacy Specialist. He or she will help you to access resources in the community, set and update your goals, connect you with employment opportunities, and transition you to college.
